## Additional Advising Comments for Liberal Arts Majors

Full time Liberal Arts students who plan their degree and follow the intended sequence are able to earn a General Education Academic Certificate in three semesters and complete a Liberal Arts AA in four semesters. General education courses and electives can be selected so a student earns credits toward a minor at their transfer institution.

General Education course lists can be found on pages 58-63 of the course catalog.
**Students must select an " E " designated (Ethical Reasoning) course to fulfill one of their General Education requirements.

## Footnotes:

1 Select electives based on interest, career goals, transfer institution requirements, and background.

2 Liberal Arts majors are encouraged to select their Research \& Writing and Advanced Study courses early because the majority of these courses have prerequisites. The needed prerequisites may be taken as GEM courses or as electives. The elective course in semester two should be used to complete a prerequisite for an Advanced Study course that is not a GEM. Consult the CWI Catalog for a listing of prerequisites to the Research \& Writing and Advanced Study courses.

3 This course should be taken in the student's final semester; it has a prerequisite of ENGL 102 and 40 credits of successfully completed coursework. Students should save at least one major assignment (signature assignment) from each of their courses to put into either their General Education portfolio or Liberal Arts portfolio, which will be completed in this course.

## - To ensure efficient degree planning, students who intend to transfer to a four-year institution should review the lower-division degree requirements of the institution they plan to attend.
